We have been the beneficiary of philatelic material donations from members and outside parties. gifts have added to our Live Auction and Kiloware Programs as well publications and books for our expansive archives and research library.

In turn, because our Club has been the recipient of others' generosity, we have been able to pass on a goodly part of these donations. It has enhanced the efforts of our Youth Philately committee in providing enough stamps, covers, postal cards, and research material for youngsters in the Sequoia Youth Club to enjoy and learn all about Philately. It has also allowed us to send boxes of stamps to overseas orphanages and other worthy organizations.

All of the above are what is referred to as "In-kind" donations. But there is one other "In-kind" donation the Club receives that allows it to operate without financial worries. 

Military Letters — From the Military Stamp Society



which is a transformation of the original depiction of three crowns, indicating Crown Post. The Crown Post operated in Sweden from the 18th century until 1873.

5) It bears delivery instructions, which read: "Forward without delay by 3rd Major Company postman to No. 33 Dahl at 2nd Major Company whom it will be incumbent upon to forward speedily further. Leaving 1 o'clock p.m. July 15-17 14 December 1834" [18 14/12 34].

The cover is addressed to Lieutenant Colonel of the 2nd Major Company in Uppsala. Because this is the outer cover and the original contents of the letter are not present, the sender and point of origin are unknown.

This 1834 Swedish military cover has several interesting attributes.

1) It is a feather letter with a white feather attached using a wax seal, meaning the postman had to deliver the letter urgently, i.e., as an express letter. 2) It is known as "Soldat's mail" or Soldier's Mail. 3) It was sent 14 December 1834 and is marked "Special Regimental Orders." 4) It bears a "meander"

Henry Fonda

With the 11th stamp in its Legends of Hollywood series, the U.S. Postal Service honors Henry Fonda, one of America's greatest actors, on the 100th anniversary of his May 16, 1905, birth. Stamp artist Drew Struzan based the image on a portrait of Fonda from a 1941 Frank Powolny photograph. For the selvage, art director Derry Noyes used a photograph as a basis for a pencil drawing showing Fonda in his iconic performance as dispossessed farmer Tom Joad in The Grapes of Wrath (1940).

Text in the selvage reads: Henry Fonda (1905-1982) was noted for his naturalness and sincerity in stage roles and on the screen. Effective in comedic or

dramatic roles, he typically played a thoughtful man of integrity. In a career spanning nearly 50 years, he won many honors, including a Tony Award in 1948 for his work in the Broadway production of Mister Roberts and the Academy Award for best actor in 1982 for On Golden Pond.

The Postal Service will issue a 37-cent, Henry Fonda commemorative stamp (Item 458600) in a pressure- sensitive adhesive (PSA) pane of 20, on May 20, 2005, in Los Angeles, California. The stamp designed by Derry Noyes of Washington, DC, goes on sale nationwide May 21, 2005.

This image is scanned from the selvage of a block of stamps issued by the United States. The Mr. ZIP character was used by the Postal Service to advertise the idea of the Zone Improvement Plan (ZIP) postal coding system. Mr. ZIP appeared on several stamps and stamprelated publicity items. This image comes from the 1970's.

For many years, the Postal Service has been placing nonstamp images in the selvage (paper areas outside the stamp images, near the edge of the sheet) with printing plate numbers, copyright notices, slogans, and other markings. Examples of the messages include "MAIL EARLY IN THE DAY" and "USE ZIP CODE".

Collectors have accumulated blocks of stamps with plate number markings for many years. These additional markings, however, are quite common, and are priced lower than plate numbers in the Scott catalog.
