Jonas Salk

Dr. Jonas Salk (63-cents) (First-Class two-ounce rate)

This issuance in the Distinguished Americans series honors Dr. Jonas Salk (1914-1995), who was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 1977 for developing the first safe and effective vaccine against paralytic poliomyelitis. Periodic outbreaks of this worldwide viral disease — also called infantile paralysis or simply "polio" — paralyzed or killed thousands of people annually in the United

States alone before the Salk vaccine became available in 1955.

Artist Mark Summers created the portrait on the stamp. As reference, he used a photograph (courtesy of the March of Dimes Birth Defects Foundation) of Dr. Salk taken in the Virus Research Laboratory at the University of Pittsburgh in October 1954. At the time of the photograph, Dr. Salk was checking the results of a polio test funded by the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis through its March of Dimes campaign. In 1979, the "March of Dimes" also became the official name of the foundation.

In my final report on the Penpex 2005, I wanted to share some thoughts about the history of the show and some of the highlights from this year.




Like the modern Olympics, Penpex has a long history — well maybe not as a long as the Olympics but it does date back to the 1940s or 50s. We have cachets dating back to the early 50's thanks, to a donation by Ed Rosen (see below).

But like the Olympics, there was a period of time when Penpex wasn't held. Our current show format dates back to December 1983, 24 years ago (I have counted this on my fingers several times). More on the history of the show in the coming year.

This last Penpex (2005) was an artistic and worthwhile event in spite of the fact that major changes had to be made at the last minute. The exhibits were full, the banquet was held and because most of the exhibitors were from out of the area they could not be recognized in person. The silent auction went very well and the snack bar was relocated because of space but was very successful.

Cachets were a success all year and did well at the show, the youth/beginner area was alive with inquisitive on lookers. The raffle also did very well with some excellent prizes.
