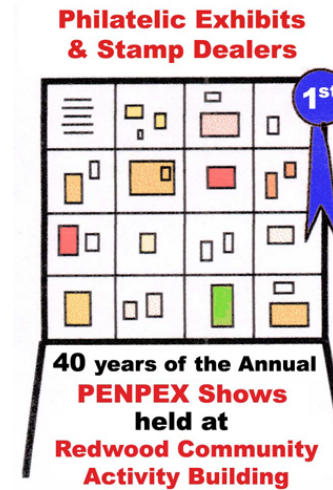
### Join Sequoia Stamp Club

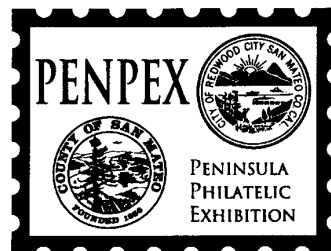
# Welcome to PENPEX

## Friends of the Western Philatelic Library

The Friends of the Western Philatelic Library are volunteers who are dedicated to housing, maintaining and expanding the largest philatelic library west of State College, PA. We are located fifteen miles south of Redwood City, in Sunnyvale. The main collection of books, periodicals, pamphlets, tear sheets, stored items, and books for sale, etc. requires over 3,000 lineal feet of shelving, 48 file drawers for unbound periodicals and 30 drawers for pamphlets (with a 15 drawer index)! The computerized catalog lists 4,090 books, 5,500 pamphlets and over 1,400 catalogs, and is expanding weekly!



The WPL was organized as the South Bay Philatelic Library in 1969. By 1971, as the size, importance and mission grew, the name was changed to Western Philatelic Library. Today, it provides in-library use of scarce research books, catalogs, journals, and more common research material. Most material may be borrowed upon presentation of adequate identification.

The WPL is located in Building 6, Room 6 of the Raynor Park Facility, 1550 Partridge Ave., Sunnyvale, CA. Call (408) 733-0336 for current hours. The library will **have free give-aways and be selling tear sheets** in the main hall.
