



The Friends of the Western Philatelic Library are volunteers who are dedicated to housing, maintaining and expanding the largest philatelic library west of State College, PA. We are located fifteen miles south of Redwood City, in Sunnyvale. The main collection of books, periodicals, pamphlets, tear sheets, stored items, and books for sale, etc. requires over 3,000 lineal feet of shelving, 48 file drawers for unbound periodicals and 30 drawers for pamphlets (with a 15 drawer index)! The computerized catalog lists 4,090 books, 5,500 pamphlets and over 1,400 catalogs, and is expanding weekly!



The WPL was organized as the South Bay Philatelic Library in 1969. By 1971, as the size, importance and mission grew, the name was changed to Western Philatelic Library. Today, it provides in-library use of scarce research books, catalogs, journals, and more common research material. Most material may be borrowed upon presentation of adequate identification.

The WPL is located in Building 6, Room 6 of the Raynor Park Facility, 1550 Partridge Ave., Sunnyvale, CA. Call (408) 733-0336 for current hours. The library will have a free give-away table in the main hall.

This Years Theme: Local Anniversaries

150th Anniversary of San Mateo County: Once called "the most corrupt county in California," San Mateo County was formed due to political intrigues and backroom deals in 1856. The Consolidation Act, authored by Horace Hawes, cut off approximately nine-tenths of the County of San Francisco and provisioned that a new county would be organized without delay. While the Act was not to have gone into effect until July, an election was held on May 12, 1856 and opportunists had hoped to gain control of the county. Redwood City was selected to be the county seat.

60th Anniversary of the 49er's: The 49ers began play in 1946 as a charter member of the All-America Football Conference and joined the NFL in 1950 after the AAFC merged into the older league. The team currently shares the record for most Super Bowl victories (5) with the Dallas Cowboys and the Pittsburgh Steelers. They are considered one of the greatest teams in NFL history.

50th Anniversary of the hard drive: Today, the hard drive is found everywhere--from the PCs to MP3 players. The first hard drive, the IBM RAMAC, was first introduced in 1956. It was huge housing and 50 24-inch platters. The RAMAC could hold 5MB--about the storage that today is needed for one 5-minute MP3.
