### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE by Jim Giacomazzi - July 12, 2011

In March, my wife Cathy and I had the pleasure of accompanying a local choir and orchestra group, Viva la Musica, on their trip to perform Mozart's Requiem in Prague and Dresden. It was a wonderful excursion, especially in Prague where we had the opportunity to visit sites such as the Prague Castle, Charles Bridge, the Old-New Synagogue, Wenceslas Square, the National Museum, and a sobering visit to the Terezin Memorial. However, as I try to do on most vacations, I managed to fit in some philatelic activities as well by visiting the main post office, a stamp dealer, and the postal museum.



On Saturday morning we visited the main post office, which was located just off Wenceslas Square. Upon entering you take a ticket, and wait for your number to be called. It was all business, and since the clerk spoke no English it was impossible to do more than purchase some stamps for the post cards that we wanted to send to friends back home. I am sure that during the week, service would be much better as a philatelic window would be available.

After lunch we visited the postal museum. The postal museum was founded in 1918 as the first museum established in the newly independent Czechoslovakia. Since 1988 it has been located in Vavra House, a former home of the Prague millers. As we were the only visitors to the museum at the time, we were given a very personalized tour of the building by the friendly



staff, which we greatly enjoyed in spite of the language barrier. A visit to the museum is much enhanced by the beautiful murals from the year 1847 by the famous Czech painter Josef Navratil. On the first floor is a vast international collection of stamps arranged in vertical pullout drawers. The museum also features temporary exhibits about the history of the Czech postal service and stamp design. Visitors have at their disposal a library and reading room with literature from the field of postal history and philately. At the gift shop we were able to purchase postal items and souvenirs.



Walking back to our hotel from the museum, we spotted a sign that read "Filatelie Penkava", which turned out to be a pleasant little stamp shop with a friendly owner. After perusing his display case, I found an interesting item that I purchased as a souvenir of our philatelic adventure. It is a cover with a Brno postmark from May 8, 1966, and a marking that reads "PIGEONGRAM". The shop

owner told us that it was created by the "Klub Filatelistu" of Brno and traveled by carrier pigeon. I will have to do some diligent research to see if his story holds up. I am hoping that along with my wonderful memories and photos of our trip to Prague, I also now have a new item for my exhibit on unique ways of transporting the mail.

## The General Who Became President


As a young boy growing up in Abilene, Kansas, Dwight Eisenhower ("Ike") played football and baseball and it was in playing these sports that he learned about leadership. He went to West Point where he played sports until he badly damaged his knee. He met "Maime" at his first assignment at Fort Sam Houston in Texas and they married in 1916. They lost their first son Icky to Scarlet Fever when he was just three years old. Their second son John was born on August 3, 1922.

He continued his military career and became quite popular during WWII for his leadership and good decision-making. When the war was over, Eisenhower was urged by his friends to run for the Presidency. He was reluctant to do so, and took a job as President of Columbia University.

Then on June 25, 1950, the North Koreans invaded South Korea and President Truman sent in the military to help defend South Korea. Truman offered Eisenhower the position to command the NATO (North Atlantic Treaty Organization)'s military operations, and live and work at NATO's headquarters in Paris. Eisenhower took the job. However, still friends and politicians continued to urge him to run for President. They said that Americans needed his strong leadership. Finally he agreed that he would run and chose Richard Nixon as his running mate. Dwight Eisenhower became the 34<sup>th</sup> President of the United States.

Six months later, Eisenhower pulled American US troopers out of Korea. In the 1950s, tensions were high regarding nuclear war. Eisenhower flew to Geneva to discuss an open air policy with Russian leaders to make it impossible for either party to proceed with an undetected nuclear attack. The Russians were not agreeable. However, a new respect was obtained at the Geneva Summit and it was a strong achievement for the Cold War between the two countries.

During his second term in office, Eisenhower continued to concentrate on keeping peaceful relations with all countries, including all of Europe. John F. Kennedy followed Eisenhower and became the next President of the United States in January 1961. After the Presidency, Eisenhower wrote his memoirs. Eisenhower died on March 28, 1969. Eisenhower would go home again, to be buried in Abilene, Kansas.


