PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE by Jim Giacomazzi, October 10, 2011

I'll bet that every general worldwide stamp collector has a country or topic that is special to him or her. It may be the country of your heritage, a country that you visited on vacation, or a topic



that relates to your career or other important activity in you life. For my wife Cathy the country is Ireland (she's Irish) and her latest topic is airline etiquettes (she was a flight attendant for United Airlines for almost 39 years). For me it is the country of Venezuela where I served as a Peace Corps volunteer from 1965 to 1967. I lived in the beautiful city of San Cristobal, high in the Andes Mountains near the border with Colombia, where I taught

PE in schools and served as the state basketball coach. Many items in my worldwide cover collection are letters I sent home to my parents while I was living in Venezuela.

Many Venezuelan stamps feature figures from its history, especially Simon Bolivar who is considered to be the liberator of the country. It seems that every town in Venezuela has a central

plaza with a statue of Simon Bolivar, end even the currency is named after him. Venezuela had a very stable government and economy during the time that I was there. However, the country is very dependent on oil, and the collapse of oil prices in the 1980's coupled with huge external debts crippled the economy. Failed economic policies and political instability led to the rise of Hugo Chavez, who continues to serve as president today.

#### President's Message (Cont'd) - By Jim Giacomazzi

Venezuelan stamps are interesting to collect. There are many topicals such as birds, animals, fish, orchids, and sports. Baseball is very popular in Venezuela as evidenced by Omar Vizquel



and Pablo Sandoval playing for the SF Giants. During the period from 1951-54, Venezuela produced one of the largest sets of stamps ever issued featuring the arms of the nation, the federal district of Caracas, the twenty states, and the two federal territories. The total number of values in the series is 168 for regular postage and 216 for airmail. Since I collect used items, to complete this series has been a real challenge. An additional challenge is to find the "short 1" variety of

the 10 centimos airmail stamp of which one is found on each sheet of one hundred. The illustrated pair shows a normal stamp along with a short 1.

From 1915 to 1942 official stamps were designed by applying a "GN" perforation to regular issue stamps. The illustrated stamp shows the GN perforation on a one Bolivar stamp. The stamp was printed on bluish Winchester security paper, making it almost unreadable. EFO's such as inverted and double overprints and imperfs abound on Venezuelan stamps, making for interesting collateral material. Local issues with abundant counterfeits make access to reference material and specialized catalogues a big asset.



As you can see, collecting Venezuelan stamps is challenging and fun, and it brings back fond memories for me of the time I spent there. I hope you have a special country or topic to collect, and that it gives you as much pleasure as collecting Venezuela does for me.



#### TWELVE SIGNS ON STAMPS

When I was twenty-three years old and living in Queens, NY, I corresponded with a legally blind man who lived in a small town in West Virginia. He told me that his town was so small that the post office did not have a mailman to deliver the mail. Everyone who wanted mail delivery rented a post office box and needed to pick up their mail when the post office was open. I do not know how true this was, as I never visited my friend at his small town. Nonetheless, he traveled to me on a Greyhound Bus where I met up with him one planned afternoon at Penn Station.


My friend and I communicated by cassette tapes, which he said he and I could send each other for free in the US mail, as long "FREE MATTER FOR THE BLIND" was handwritten on the package in the upper right corner where postage would normally be placed.

One day he mailed me a package of about fifteen hour long cassette tapes and asked if I could buy a copy of <u>Linda Goodman's Love Signs</u> and read the book to him on the tapes. I resisted at first, telling him that it would not sound very professional with my Queens accent. However, he told me that he thoroughly enjoyed astrology, the study of how the Sun, Moon and planets in our solar system affect the characteristics of people depending upon when they were born. He wanted to listen to the book on tapes, and there was no other way to be able to do this. So, I agreed to the task and sat down mostly on weekends, free from work and read out loud for hours at a time, <u>Linda Goodman's Love Signs</u>.

I learned in detail about the twelve signs of the Zodiac: Aries (the Ram), Taurus (the Bull), Gemini (the Twins), Cancer (the Crab), Leo (the Lion), Virgo (the Virgin), Libra (the Scales), Scorpio (the Scorpion), Sagittarius (the Archer), Capricorn (the Sea-Goat), Aquarius (the Water-Bearer), and Pieces (the Fish). These signs can be found on several international stamps. I have seen them on stamps from Israel and Switzerland Below the twelve signs can be seen on 2007 mint stamps from Greece.



Her 12-year old sister Sebrianne also won a Star Blue Ribbon for her U.S. collection, Best of Section 4-H Award, and Best of Show Ribbon in Junior



Stills category for ages 12 to 14. The girls are enrolled in Ocean Grove Charter school and both are members of Stamps R Us, the youth stamp club sponsored by Sequoia Stamp Club.

Sebrianne began collecting stamps at age 7 or 8. She was encouraged to start by her father who has an interest in early U.S. stamps. When asked why she likes collecting stamps, Sebrianne replied, "It reminds me of stickers, but it's better because it helps me learn geography. Some countries' names are different on stamps, and you have to look them up on a map to find them." She especially likes to collect US stamps, and also enjoys collecting dogs on stamps and stamps that celebrate holidays.

Dina collects mostly worldwide stamps, but especially enjoys collecting topicals such as animals, flowers, and dance. She began her collection after visiting the youth area of the 2010 PENPEX stamp show in Redwood City and meeting with Sequoia Youth group's Stamps R Us coordinator Darlene Hickok. Dina stated, "Collecting stamps is like trying to solve a puzzle because you have to find stamps that match the pages in your album." Dina and Sebrianne also belong to the El Sereno 4-H Club and are both active in dance. Both parents support their daughters' stamp collecting activities. Their mom Nadine said with a smile that while the girls were preparing their exhibits for the fair the family was unable to eat at the dining room table because it was completely covered with stamps.

Dear Philatelist:




